

B – TERMS OF COMPETITION

1. ELIGIBILITY

Players must meet the eligibility requirements provided in order to be admitted to a Competition.
(See the General Conditions of Competition and the Specific Conditions issued in the current *Normativa Tecnica* and/or in the Entry Form for the relevant Tournament).

Note: At any time, if it is discovered that a competitor does not meet the eligibility provisions at the closing date for entries, he will be immediately removed from the results (even after the Competition is closed).

2. HOW TO DECIDE TIES

See the current *Normativa Tecnica* issued by the Italian Golf Federation.

3. RECORDING AREA, RETURNING OF SCORECARD

The Recording Area may include, but is not limited to; temporary buildings, tents or permanent rooms. Others may be defined on the Official Notice Board. A scorecard will be deemed returned when a player has completely left the recording area.

4. RESULT OF MATCH – COMPETITION CLOSED

- Match Play: The result of a match is deemed "officially announced" when the result of the match or the pairings for the next turn of play has been recorded on the official board and/or the website www.federgolf.it
- Stroke Play: The result of the competition is deemed officially announced and the competition is closed, when the final results sheet has been recorded on the official board and/or the website www.federgolf.it
- For stroke-play qualifying followed by match-play, see Rule 20.2e(2).

5. ANTI-DOPING

See the current *Normativa Tecnica* issued by the Italian Golf Federation.

6. CODE OF CONDUCT (Rule 1.2b)

Beside what stated in Rule 1.2a regarding the standard of player conduct, the Italian Golf Federation has adopted the following code of conduct:

- The prohibition on players entering in no play zones where the entrance is forbidden.
- The use of unacceptable dress code
- An unacceptable behaviour that a player may be penalized for during the round for:
 - Failure to care for the course, for example not raking bunkers or no replacing or filling divots.
 - Use of unacceptable language.
 - Abuse of clubs.

Penalty for Breach of Code of Conduct:

1st. breach: warning from the Rules Official or a Committee Member

2nd. breach: one stroke penalty

3rd. breach: general penalty (two strokes penalty in stroke play; Loss of Hole in match play)

4th. breach: disqualification in stroke play (disqualification in match play)

Note: in case of serious breach (i.e. abusive language towards a Rules Official or a Committee Member, or for endangering another person) the Committee may disqualify the player for serious misconduct under rule 1.2a. The player will also be subordinate to the Disciplinary Regulation (*Regolamento di Giustizia*) of the Italian Golf Federation.

The following Conditions of Competition apply only to team Competitions:

7. ADVICE IN TEAM COMPETITIONS

In accordance with the Model Local Rule H-2, each team may appoint one person (Team Advisor), who is allowed to give advice to members of that team and to whom team members are allowed to ask for advice. Such person, who is not an outside influence, but is part of the player's side, must be communicated to the committee during the Captains' Meeting.

FEDERAZIONE ITALIANA GOLF – 2020

The following Terms of Competition and Local Rules, together with any additional Local Rules and notes published by the Committee and any regulation in the *Normativa Tecnica* issued by the Italian Golf Federation, will apply to all National and International Championships organized by the Italian Golf Federation and played in accordance with the Rules of Golf approved by the R&A Rules Limited. The full text of any Local Rule please consult the Official Guide to the Rules of Golf, Effective January 2019, published by the R&A Rules Limited.



Unless otherwise noted, the penalty for breach of a local rule is the General Penalty.

Match Play: Loss of Hole. Stroke Play: Two Strokes

A – LOCAL RULES

The following Local Rules, together with any additions or amendments as published by the Italian Golf Federation at each golf course, will apply until further notice to all Tournaments under the auspices of the Rules and Championship Committee.

1. OUT OF BOUNDS (RULE 18.2)

- A ball is out of bounds when it is beyond any wall defining a boundary.
- A ball that is played from one side of a road which is defined as out of bounds and comes to rest on the other side of that road, is out of bounds. This is true even if the ball comes to rest on another part of the course that is in bounds for other holes.

2. PENALTY AREAS (RULE 17)

- Opposite Side Same Distance Relief for Red Penalty Areas.**
The additional local rules for each tournament will specify which (if any) red penalty areas have a same distance option on the opposite side. Model local rule B-2.1 applies only to the penalty areas that are listed.
- Opposite side Relief Where Ball Last Crossed Edge of Penalty Area Where The Edge and the Boundary of the Course Coincide.**
When a player's ball last crossed the edge of the penalty area where the edge of the penalty area and a boundary of the course coincide, that edge is deemed red and opposite side relief is available under model local rule B-2.1.
- Dropping Zones for Penalty Areas**
Where a dropping zone is marked for a penalty area, it is an additional option under penalty of one stroke. The dropping zone is a relief area under rule 14.3, meaning that a ball must be dropped in and come to rest in the relief area.

3. BACK-ON-LINE RELIEF; PLAYING FROM OUTSIDE THE RELIEF AREA

Model Local Rule E-12 is in effect when taking Back-On-the-Line Relief under any Rule. Note the Back-on-the-line options in Rules 16.1c(2), 17.1d(2), 19.2b and 19.3b.

4. ABNORMAL COURSE CONDITIONS (RULE 16.1)

- Ground Under Repair**
 - All areas bounded by white lines including spectator crossing points where marked.
 - Seams of Cut Turf: Model Local Rule F-7 is in effect.
 - French drains (stone-filled drainage ditches).
 - For holes remaining after removing movable obstructions in part of the general area, free relief is available for lie of ball or area of intended swing, but there is no relief interference to the stance.
- Immovable Obstructions**
 - White lined areas and the immovable obstruction they tie into, are treated as a single abnormal course condition.
 - Landscaped garden areas (and everything growing in them) that are completely surrounded by an immovable obstruction, are treated as a single abnormal course condition.
 - Roads or paths surfaced with woodchips or mulch. Individual pieces of woodchips are loose impediments.

c) Temporary Water

Squeegee Policy for Temporary Water removal.

If a player's ball lies on the putting green and there is interference by temporary water on the putting green, the player may take relief under rule 16.1d or have her line of play squeegeed.

The committee may squeegee greens until players are nearby and if conditions deteriorate, to keep play going, they may authorize a combination of all the above measures.

Any squeegee should be done across the line of play, must extend a reasonable distance beyond the hole (i.e. at least one club-length) and may only be carried out by committee authorized personnel.

d) Restriction on Relief from Stance in Animal Hole

Rule 16.1 is modified in this way: *Interference does not exist if the animal hole interferes with only the player's stance.*

e) Yardage Spots or Lines

Painted lines or spots (or dots) in a part of the general area cut to fairway height or less, are to be treated as ground under repair from which relief is allowed under Rule 16.1. Interference does not exist if painted lines or spots (or dots) interfere with only the player's stance.

5. IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS CLOSE TO PUTTING GREENS

Model Local Rule F-5 is in effect but is modified as follows:

For a ball in the general area, relief is allowed only when both the ball and the immovable obstruction lie in an area cut to fairway height or less.

6. INTEGRAL OBJECTS

- Bunker liners in their intended position.
- Wires, cables, wrapping or other objects when closely attached to trees or other permanent objects.
- Artificial retaining walls and pilings when located within penalty areas.
- Any closed gate attached to a boundary object.

7. PERMANENT OVERHEAD POWER LINE

Model Local Rule E-11 is in effect but only for a ball which strikes a power line located in bounds and not the supporting pole; stroke is cancelled and must be replayed.

8. MOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS

Examples include but are not limited to: free-standing advertising boards situated away from teeing grounds, drinks dispensers that are on wheels or easily lifted, all cameras and their tripods, TV microphones, free standing scoring and data masts or tripods and all crossing point indicators.

9. CLUBS AND BALLS

- Club Replacement:** Model Local Rule G-9 for replacement of a club that is broken or significantly damaged is in effect.
- List of conforming Driver Heads:** Model Local Rule G-1 is in effect.

Penalty for making a stroke with a club in breach of this local rule: Disqualification.

- Conforming Balls List:** Model Local Rule G-3 is in effect.

Penalty for making a stroke with a ball not on current list in breach of this local rule: Disqualification.

10. PACE OF PLAY POLICY (RULE 5.6b(3))

A) During the Stipulated Round

In the absence of mitigating circumstances, a group (or an individual or two players in the group) is liable to be timed if, at any time during the Stipulated Round, the (or the player) group is in excess of the time allowed, or in the case of second or subsequent groups, "Out of Position".

The first group and any group after a starter's gap will be considered to be "Out of Position" if, at any time during the round, the group's cumulative time exceeds the time allowed for the number of holes completed. Any other group will be considered "Out of Position" if it is more than the starting interval behind the group in front and has exceeded the time allowed for the number of holes played.

From the commencement of timing, the maximum time allocated for any shot is 40 seconds; 10 extra seconds are allowed for the first player to play:

- The tee shot at a par 3 hole;
- An approach shot;

- A chip or putt.

The time allowed to complete play of each hole and the entire round, is determined by the Committee and is published on the official notice board and/or on the player's scorecard, before the first round of the competition.

Penalty for Breach of Condition:

1st. breach: warning from the Rules Official ("Bad Time")

2nd. breach: one stroke penalty (Loss of Hole in match play)

3rd. breach: general penalty (two strokes penalty in stroke play; Loss of Hole in match play)

4th. breach: disqualification in stroke play (disqualification in match play)

Penalty strokes will apply to the hole at which the breach occurred. If play is delayed between holes, the penalty will apply to the next hole.

Even if a timed group comes back in position, bad times by players in that group will be carried forward until the round is completed. A player will not be penalised if he has a second bad time before being advised of his earlier bad time.

Note:

- A player who is timed will have a bad time carried forward in the round even if her group subsequently arrives back in position or within time. A player is not penalized if he has a second "Bad Time" before being informed of his first "Bad Time".
- Players may be timed without being advised.

B. In Returning Score Cards in Stroke Play

All groups must complete their stipulated round within the maximum completion time allowed by the Committee. It is players' responsibility to observe this allowed maximum time (Rule 5.6b). In the absence of mitigated circumstances, a **penalty of two strokes will apply to the 18th hole score for a breach of Rule 5.6b to ALL players:**

- of the first group, if they exceeded the maximum time allowed for 5 minutes or over;
- of any following group, if they exceeded the maximum time allowed for 5 minutes or over and if they exceeded 5 minutes or more the starting interval behind the group in front.

Notes: a) The Committee will consider as mitigated circumstances exclusively extraordinary cases.

- The Committee may waive this Condition of Competition ("maximum completion times") before the start of the competition.

11. PLAY SUSPENSION (RULE 5.7)

The following signals will be used to suspend and resume play:

Immediate Stop/Dangerous Situation: one prolonged note of the siren.

Normal non-dangerous stop: three consecutive short notes of the siren.

Resume Play: two consecutive short notes of the siren

When play is stopped in a dangerous situation, all practice areas are immediately closed.

12. PRACTICE (RULE 5)

- Practice before or between rounds in Stroke Play (Rule 5.2b):** Rule 5.2b is modified in this way: *A player must not practice on the competition course before or between rounds.*

Penalty for breach of Rule 5.2: See penalty statement in Rule 5.2.

13. TRANSPORTATION POLICY

Model local rule G-6 is in effect and modifies Rule 4.3a(1) in this way: *During a round, a player or caddie must not ride on any form of motorized transportation except as authorized or later approved by the rules committee. (A player taking a stroke and distance penalty is always authorized).*

Penalty for breach of this local rule: General Penalty for each hole during which there is a breach. A breach between holes applies to the next hole.

14. PROHIBITION OF USE OF AUDIO AND VIDEO DEVICES

Model Local Rule G-8 is in effect and modifies Rule 4.3a(1) in this way: *"During a round, a player must not listen to or watch content of any nature on a personal audio or video device".*

Penalty for breach of Local Rule: See penalty statement in Rule 4.3
